


MS. MURIEL COTMAN

Leading us in our ministry of music during Robert's absence will be Muriel Cotman, a talented musician who has played in our Sanctuary before as a featured guest piano soloist. She returns to play our new organ for the entirety of three of our worship services in August.

Muriel is now a sophomore at Victoria College, Texas, where she has been awarded an academic scholarship to study music. She is also a student member of the Presbyterian Association of Musicians as well as of the National College of Musicians Piano Guild and a collegiate member of the National Federation of Music Clubs.

Intrigued, I consulted the Psalter when I arrived at my office, and I was pleased to see that, unlike so many obnoxious slogans (from so many directions) I see these days, this bumper-sticker was intended as a simple reminder of God's power in the midst of anxiety, threat, and turmoil.

Psalm 91 bears the introduction, "Assurance of God's Protection," and, as an offering of hope, comfort, and assurance, I have copied a portion of it below:

You who live in the shelter of the Most High,
who abide in the shadow of the Almighty,
will say to the Lord, "My refuge and my fortress;
my God, in whom I trust."

For he will deliver you from the snare of the fowler
and from the deadly pestilence;
he will cover you with his pinions,
and under his wings you will find refuge;
his faithfulness is a shield and buckler. . . .

Because you have made the Lord your refuge,
the Most High your dwelling place,
no evil shall befall you,
no scourge come near your tent.
For he will command his angels concerning you
to guard you in all your ways.
On their hands they will bear you up,

so that you will not dash your foot against a stone.
You will tread on the lion and the adder,
the young lion and the serpent you will trample under foot.
Those who love me, I will deliver;
I will protect those who know my name.
When they call to me, I will answer them;
I will be with them in trouble,
I will rescue them and honor them.
With long life I will satisfy them,
and show them my salvation.

While all of this is going on, we are still searching for a camera person to help us operate our new camera equipment which we obtained with a grant from Mission

Presbytery. We need someone to be available for two hours on the Saturdays when we record our worship services and, once the pandemic has passed, for two hours on the Sundays when we gather again in the Sanctuary. Additionally, a few additional hours are necessary to process and upload each video from our new equipment to the Internet.
