




WORSHIP SERVICE AND COMMUNION ON SUNDAY, AUGUST 1, 2021

We welcome Robert Wyatt back to the organ console to lead us in music during our worship service next Sunday, August 1, 2021, the Tenth Sunday after Pentecost. Robert will be playing as our Organ Anthem, "Come to the Banquet."

Also, this Sunday we will celebrate the Lord's Supper. If you will be with us in the Sanctuary, those who are serving communion will still wear masks and individually serve each communicant who comes forward to receive the elements. For those who receive communion, however, the wearing of masks will be optional for those who have been fully vaccinated against COVID for at least two weeks. As before, please be prepared to receive (not take) the bread from the Elders and to take your own cup and dispose of it in the baskets provided as you return to your seat.

If you will not be celebrating with us in person, please be prepared to take communion from wherever you may be watching us on our website (https://www.fpcofvictoria.org/) or our Facebook page (https://www.facebook.com/fpcofvictoria/). Bread of any sort is suitable, including crackers, tortillas, etc.; any sort of fruit juice would be appropriate, as would wine or even water.
